Note 1

These figures are for two months hence they seem high. However, as the anti social behaviour reports are low, the criminal damage is up. This is mainly to graffiti appearing around the village. The CCTV is displacing this type of offence. The assault is a minor incident involving school pupils and the offender is to be advised accordingly.

Note 2

There was one burglary dwelling where laptops, which may have been left on view, where stolen. The burglary other buildings include theft of tools, a ‘sit on’ mower and pedal cycles. The reported theft is one of two pedal cycles also. There is a similar problem at Perton for this type of offence. It is recommended all bikes should be left under lock and key.

Note 3

The Road Traffic Collision again occurred along Westbeech Rd. However, once again it was out of the village and not outside the school.

Note 4

There were two reported thefts from motor vehicles and one theft of vehicle. The theft of involves a motocross bike, and one of the theft from vehicle involved the theft of a sat-nav. Again left on view.
